 - How does the board feel about adding a cleaning fee deposit, which will be used if the group does not clean up after the gathering? If the group cleans up after themselves, the deposit will be refunded.

In January, Elisabeth will be meeting with all groups that meet regularly to renew their contract agreement with the library. This agreement will include updated changes to meeting space usage.

- The library would like to install a new door counter that would provide a more accurate count of library patrons. The current door counter is useful but does require some level of guessing or estimates for the count each day.
